### School Swimming Carnival

I congratulate all the children on the manner in which they contributed to the success of our school swimming carnival and coped with the very warm conditions on Monday: the readiness of children to give of their best and to support each other set a great standard for the rest of the year. I especially commend the children who tested themselves over the 50 metre distance in a variety of strokes. For many students swimming that distance was a huge challenge and they can take great pride in the fact that they were prepared to "have a go". I thank **Mr McNamara** for his efforts in organising the carnival and I also thank the parents who came along to either support the competitors or act as officials. I congratulate all members of **Kingfisher**, the Sports House swimming champions for 2019 and commend the following children who were selected as age champions for this year:

After competing in all of his events Cameron was able to display his outstanding swimming ability by winning a 200 metre match race against Miss Watson, Miss Case, Mr Ruecroft and Mr Fisher!

Unfortunately over the past few years there has been a gradual increase in the number of children who do not feel confident about swimming 50 metres and I am aware that this is a trend across all schools. At the same time statistics show that each year an increasing number of tragic drowning related deaths occur in NSW. I take this opportunity to encourage all parents and carers to try to ensure that their children have the opportunity to develop a safe standard of competency in swimming.

### **School Procedures**

The organisational procedures we follow before and after school are particularly important in relation to the safety and welfare of students. I think it is appropriate to outline the expectations once again as we start a new year: this will assist our new families but will also act as a refresher for current students.

### When students leave their classrooms at 3:05pm:

- Students catching buses go to their designated area in the COLA and wait for Mrs Ruecroft to escort them to the bus stop
- · Children who are being picked up by their parents must wait in the COLA until their parents arrive. Students do not walk out of the grounds to meet their parents. Children need to be regularly reminded that if their parent does not come to pick them up they must speak to the teacher on duty and/or go to the front office. It is critically important for parents and carers to ensure that their children do not go ahead of them as they are leaving the school grounds. The official road safety guidelines advise that it is best for infants children to hold the hand of a responsible adult at all times when they are near a road. There have been a number of "close calls" in recent years and unfortunately there are many motorists who completely ignore the School Zone speed restrictions.

· We endeavour to have a teacher on duty at the school crossing each afternoon to escort children across the road. However, it is important for all children to be aware of the safety procedures to follow when crossing any road. Parents and Carers are asked to model good road safety practices by using the designated crossing.

The **before school procedures** are equally important. Parents are asked to note that teachers are not on duty till **8:35am** and with this in mind parents are asked to ensure that their children do not arrive at school before that time. Any students who do arrive early must sit on the steps in the COLA until the supervising teacher arrives. The bell which rings at 8:50am is a "teacher's bell" and should be ignored by the students. All children will be asked to **walk** to their designated line up places to meet their teachers when the bell rings at 8:57am. This can be particularly challenging for the infants children who are often tempted to run as soon as the bell rings! The effectiveness of our efforts to ensure the safety of students when they are arriving at or leaving school is significantly reduced if cars are parked illegally in the streets adjacent to the school. All parents and carers are asked to be mindful of following the appropriate car parking procedures to ensure that drivers have good vision of children when they are crossing the road. I also encourage you to show respect to our neighbours by not parking on their front lawns or across their driveways.

### **Parent Information Meetings**

All parents received a special letter yesterday setting out the times for this year's Parent Information Meetings which are being held during the next two weeks. These meetings are conducted in order to provide the teachers with an opportunity to present parents and carers not only with an overview of class structures, programs and avenues for communication but also to highlight the ways parents and carers can support their children's academic progress. While I urge all parents and carers to come along to these important meetings I appreciate that work commitments or clashes in times for meetings may prevent some parents from attending and with this in mind all class teachers will provide parents and carers with a written summary of the content covered during the meetings.

### **Extra Curricular Opportunities**

One of the very positive characteristics of our school culture is the readiness of staff members to give freely of their time in order to provide our students with a wide range of extra curricular activities which include: debating and public speaking, girls and boys dance groups, 11 different PSSA school sports teams, aerobics, school band, participation in the annual Starstruck experience, guitar group, and the





### About Active OOSH

Active OOSH provide a before school, after school and vacation care program for school aged children. We provide a program that is stimulating, fun and engaging. All children are given the opportunity to learn and grow through play and enjoy a wide range of activities and experiences at the service through our child focused programming.

### K-2 Zone.

The Service K - 2 zone is an area that provides children from Kindergarten to Year 2 with a range of age appropriate games and activities. This area is developed to assist the younger children with positive transitions to Primary School.

### Homework Club.

OOSH homework club is on offer daily at the Service before and after school. Children participate in jolly phonics, home readers, spelling words, mathematics, projects and speeches. The children are assisted by an educator who will guide them with any questions they may have.
