From the Principal

Dear Parents and Carers,

The ongoing implementation of the Explicit Instruction program is a key aspect of our 2018 to 2020 School Plan. During the past three years members of staff have been fortunate to have the opportunity to work closely with Mr John Fleming, the Director of the Haileybury Institute who is widely regarded as one of the leading educators in Australia. When he was Principal at Bellfield Primary (Heidelberg), the school became well known for its innovative curriculum in literacy and numeracy under his leadership. The school won several awards for its curriculum delivery and improvement in student academic performance. Among these were National Quality Schools Awards for teaching excellence. John was a member of the Minister for Education's School Improvement Leadership Group, which assisted in the development of the Blueprint for Education in Victoria and was a guest speaker at Parliament House for the launch of the National Inquiry into Literacy. In 2006 John was awarded the Bruce Wicking Award and the National Literacy and Numeracy Special Achievement Award. He was appointed to run the Berwick Campus of Haileybury

College in 2006 and now manages the School's literacy and numeracy program in the Junior School. John consults with schools across Australia and will be visiting Rathmines tomorrow to once again work with and provide support for our teachers. It was very affirming to receive the following email message from John during the final week of last year and I welcome this opportunity to publicly thank all class teachers for the professional and dedicated manner in which they have endeavored to achieve positive educational outcomes for all of our students through the implementation of the Explicit Instruction programme:

"I have been working with Rathmines Public School as an educational consultant for several years. Whilst already a very good school the school leadership wanted to further develop student achievement. Test results both within the school and externally (such as NAPLAN) have shown elite improvement. I have witnessed lessons in the majority of classrooms and the delivery of curriculum is outstanding. Of particular note is the impressive student behaviour and learning focus in all classrooms. The students are highly engaged and exceptionally motivated."

Parent Information Sessions

I trust that the parent information sessions conducted during the past two weeks have proved to be beneficial for parents and carers. Overviews of the content covered in the meetings are available from class teachers for anyone who was unable to attend the meetings due to other commitments. I take this opportunity to stress that the meetings should be seen as having been a "first step" in developing a relationship of shared responsibility with class teachers for your child's education. As the school year progresses I encourage you not to hesitate to contact class teachers regarding an appointment if you wish to discuss any matters of concern. I also take this opportunity to remind parents and carers that the **Term 1 parent teacher interviews** will be held from 3:30pm till 7:00pm on Tuesday 19th and Wednesday 20th March. Details regarding the process for making **online bookings** for these important interviews will be sent home next week.

School Sport Programme

Students at Rathmines Public are fortunate to be able to participate in a wide variety of sporting opportunities which are provided as part of an overall sports programme for students in primary classes. As we start a new school year I believe there is value in highlighting not only the different aspects of this programme but also the guidelines which the school is required to follow. Mr McNamara has responsibility for overseeing all matters relating to primary sport and has particular responsibility for organising our annual swimming, cross country and athletics carnivals as well as being the school's representative on the Westlakes PSSA Sports Association. As a school we are indebted to Troy for all the time and effort he contributes to this role.

Rathmines Public enters teams in 11 different PSSA competitions and also participates in competitions run by NSW Touch, NSW Rugby, OZtag and the Newcastle Knights. Inclusion in these representative sporting teams is based on the outcome of school based selection trials and guidelines provided by the NSW PSSA. Students who gain selection in a team are required to display a high level of commitment to training sessions before or after school and to also display the highest level of sportsmanship and team spirit when playing for the school. In addition, students with above average ability in a particular sport are eligible to

take part in **zone selection trials** conducted by the Westlakes PSSA. Each school is usually restricted to sending a maximum of **four students** to a trial. Selection in a Westlakes squad is the first step on a pathway to possible selection in a NSW PSSA representative team. (eg ex-student **Jake Riley's** inclusion in the NSW PSSA Golf team). In the same way, students who are selected to represent RPS at the zone swimming, cross country and athletics carnivals, as a result of their performances at our school swimming carnival, have the chance to progress through to Hunter and possibly NSW representation (eg **Cameron Gawn's** selection in the NSW swimming team last year). It is important to note that the NSW PSSA is responsible for setting the guidelines for selection procedures. **An important change which has occurred this year relates to the sport of netball which is now classed as a mixed sport and is no longer restricted to girls. As a result, boys as well as girls are eligible to try out for selection in the school, zone, regional and state netball teams. NB schools may enter one team which may include girls and boys who have been selected on ability.**

The Westlakes PSSA also conducts a series of annual **Gala Days** which are **non competitive** and are designed to give **all primary students** the chance to play sport with students from other schools in our zone. These gala days generally run on separate days for junior (Years 3 and 4) and senior (Years 5 and 6) students.

Sports News

I congratulate all the players who represented our school in the **Paul Harragon Cup** rugby league 7's carnival held at Windale on Tuesday of this week. The boys displayed great team spirit throughout the day and after their four pool games they qualified for the final which was played against Corpus Christie Primary, Waratah. Both teams scored two tries in this match and as a result the game went to extra time. The defence from both teams was amazing and the final had to go to a second period of extra time. Eventually Bailey Sutherland, our team captain who had led from the front all day in attack and defence, crossed the line for the match winning try. This is the first time our school has brought home the trophy for this annual carnival. When presenting the trophy to the Rathmines boys, Paul Harragon said that it was the best final he had watched in the 20 years of the



competition and he was full of praise for the commitment and skill levels displayed by both teams. The boys will switch codes next Monday and start training for the Rugby Union 7's competition which starts in a few weeks.
