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From the Principal

Dear Parents and Carers,

The Australian Curriculum, Assessment and Reporting Authority (ACARA) is responsible for Australia's national reporting program, including the My School website. The My School website is updated annually with the previous year's NAPLAN results.

For several years, ACARA has released information on **schools** demonstrating substantially above average gain in student reading and/or numeracy achievement, as measured by NAPLAN, as students progress from Year 3 to Year 5 and from Year 7 to Year 9. The following extracts of correspondence received at the end of last term from David De Carvalho, the Chief Executive Officer of ACARA, highlight the fact that Rathmines Public has, for the second year in a row, been acknowledged by ACARA in this way.

in reading and/or numeracy achievement, as measured by NAPLAN.

On behalf of ACARA, I would like to extend my congratulations to you and your school community on this achievement. Improvement in student literacy and/or numeracy of this magnitude, as measured by NAPLAN, is significant and worthy of highlighting and acknowledging.

We will be providing journalists with the names of some schools that have been identified as having demonstrated substantially above average gain, as well as with embargoed access to the 2019 My School data. We will provide this information to media so leaders in schools with above average gain can talk about how they achieved these gains, and thereby enable other schools to learn from them."

To be once again recognised by ACARA in this way is further affirmation for the ongoing dedication of all staff members to provide the children in their care with a high quality and engaging learning environment. A review of the factors which contributed to the 2018 NAPLAN results highlights the effectiveness of the Explicit Instruction program which is in the fourth year of implementation at the school, the excellent level of collaboration between teachers and sharing of best practice, the ongoing implementation of the Targeted Early Numeracy program in Kinder and Stage 1 classes, the creative and productive use of technology, and the intervention and support programs which are in place at our school. I have no doubt that the increasing emphasis placed on student wellbeing, and the provision of a safe and supportive learning environment, are also very positive contributing factors.

I congratulate and thank all staff members on behalf of the parents, carers and students in our school community.

ANZAC Commemorations

Students from all grades should be proud of the manner in which they contributed to the ANZAC commemorative ceremonies conducted in the Wangi and Rathmines communities on ANZAC Day. The children once again rose to the occasion and represented our school with distinction. - the traditional **Kindergarten Orientation Days** and **Parent Information Evening** which are held during term 4.




Opportunity Class Placements 2020

NAPLAN

On Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday next week all Year 3 and Year 5 students will participate in the 2019 National Assessment Program for Literacy and Numeracy (NAPLAN). NAPLAN assesses Reading, Writing, Spelling, Grammar and Numeracy. Parents and carers are asked to make a special effort to ensure that their child's attendance at school is not disrupted on the NAPLAN testing days. It is important to remember that NAPLAN tests are not pass/fail tests. It is one of a number of important tools used by teachers to measure student progress. NAPLAN assesses the literacy and numeracy skills that students are already learning through the school curriculum. Teachers have ensured that students are familiar with the test formats and have been provided with appropriate support and guidance.

Star Struck 2019

Our school has a long tradition of involvement in Star Struck. Students in our senior classes have once again been given an opportunity to be selected in the Star Struck team and to be involved in the 2019 production of "No Limits". Dear Parent/Carer.

Hunter Valley Buses (HVB) are writing to you as a provider of school bus services to your child's school. HVB would like to address some concerns regarding the current use of School Opal Cards.

Transport for NSW (TfNSW) provides eligible school students with free or subsidised travel under the School Student Transport Scheme (SSTS) between home and school during school terms. There is no provision under the scheme to fund the carriage of students to or from any other location.

When using a School Opal Card, it is a condition of use that students must tap on at the beginning of a trip and tap off at the end of a trip at an Opal Card reader.

Our data indicates that only 40% of students with School Opal Cards are using them correctly.

Data gathered from Opal taps are used to determine the number of services provided to your school. If students don't tap on and tap off, lack of perceived patronage could lead to a service appearing underutilised, prompting a review of the number of services provided.

As a part of our campaign and ongoing commitment to provide the level of service needed for your school, HVB may have visible presence of Customer Support Officers both on buses and at schools to assist students in the correct use of School Opal Cards.

HVB are asking that students become aware of the following travel options to avoid any possible repercussions with either our Customer Support Team or TfNSW Revenue Protection Officers:

About Active OOSH

Active OOSH provide a before school, after school and vacation care program for school aged children. We provide a program that is stimulating, fun and engaging. All children are given the opportunity to learn and grow through play and enjoy a wide range of activities and experiences at the service through our child focused programming.

K-2 Zone.

The Service K - 2 zone is an area that provides children from Kindergarten to Year 2 with a range of age appropriate games and activities. This area is developed to assist the younger children with positive transitions to Primary School.

Homework Club.

OOSH homework club is on offer daily at the Service before and after school. Children participate in jolly phonics, home readers, spelling words, mathematics, projects and speeches. The children are assisted by an educator who will guide them with any questions they may have.

The service organise extra curricular activities 5 days a week based on the children's interests. Some of the activities include:
