From the Principal

Dear Parents and Carers.

Reconciliation Australia has announced that the theme of this year's National Reconciliation Week (NRW) is "Grounded in Truth: Walk Together with Courage". Announcing the theme for 2019 Reconciliation Australia's Chief Executive Officer, Karen Mundine, commented on the fact that Reconciliation is ultimately about relationships and that like all effective relationships, the one between Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people and other Australians must be grounded in truth. During this very special week on our national calendar Reconciliation Australia is inviting all Australians to learn more about Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander cultures and histories and to share that knowledge and help us grow as a nation. NRW is held annually from 27th May to 3rd June and is preceded by National Sorry Day on 26th May. The two dates commemorate two significant milestones in the reconciliation journey — the successful 1967 referendum in which there was overwhelming support for Aboriginal people being included in the census, and the High Court Mabo decision which acknowledged native title and was a landmark



ATTENDANCE REQUIREMENTS

Regular attendance at school is important for students to reach their potential. The school is required by law to record the reason for any absences of students.

Parents/caregivers must ensure their children attend school every day. On occasion, your child may need to be absent from school. Justified reasons for student absences may include:

- being sick or having an infectious disease
- having an unavoidable medical appointment
- being required to attend a recognised religious holiday
- exceptional or urgent family circumstances e.g. attending a funeral

There are several ways to communicate your child's absence to the school.

- Skoolbag App
- Direct school email: rathmines-p.school@det.nsw.edu.au
- Note from the parent/caregiver

Please note: A phone call may be made to the school regarding a student absence, however the parent/caregiver must also provide an explanation in writing.

Parents or carers are required to explain any absence of their children within 7 days from the first day of any period of absence. Where an explanation has not been received within the 7-day timeframe, the school will record the absence as unjustified on the student's record.

Late arrivals

It is recommended that students be at school no later than 8.50am so there is enough time for your child to make a smooth transition from playground to classroom. If your child is late, you and the child are to report directly to the office prior to going to the classroom to explain the reason for being late and to obtain a late arrival pass.

About Active OOSH

Active OOSH provide a before school, after school and vacation care program for school aged children. We provide a program that is stimulating, fun and engaging. All children are given the opportunity to learn and grow through play and enjoy a wide range of activities and experiences at the service through our child focused programming.

K-2 Zone.

The Service K - 2 zone is an area that provides children from Kindergarten to Year 2 with a range of age appropriate games and activities. This area is developed to assist the younger children with positive transitions to Primary School.

Homework Club.

OOSH homework club is on offer daily at the Service before and after school. Children participate in jolly phonics, home readers, spelling words, mathematics, projects and speeches. The children are assisted by an educator who will guide them with any questions they may have.

Extra curricular.

The service organise extra curricular activities 5 days a week based on the children's interests. Some of the activities include:

- Dynamic Mosaics art club.
 - OOSH Masterchef.
- Little Einstein's Science.
 - Kids Bop dancing.
- Specialised sport clinics.
- Cultural group incursions.
 - Crafty Creations.

Activities on offer.

There are a wide range of activities on offer daily that include:

 - Outdoor sports games.

Breakfast + Afternoon Tea Club.

Active OOSH provide breakfast and afternoon tea daily. This is all inclusive in the daily fee. The menu is developed in consultation with industry professionals and our menu is displayed at the service for families to view. The meals are designed to be nutritious, and offer new tastes and textures so eating can be an educational and cultural experience.

Children with food allergies or special dietary requirements are catered for in our inclusive programming practices. Water stations are available to children, both indoors and outdoors.
