#### **School Concert**


#### **Debating News**

Mrs Bristow has kindly prepared the following debating report which highlights the achievements of our two debating teams during the current debating season:

"The Premier's Debating Challenge Round Robin season is drawing to a close with only one postponed debate to go. In the past two weeks we had the Round 3 home debate with Rathmines MMnM's v Rathmines Raiders. The topic "That parents should have their Year 6 children babysit their younger siblings" was fiercely debated with the MMnM's as the negative team being successful. Then in Round 4 a debate where both teams, Rathmines MMnM's and Bonnells Bay Beasts, were on equal win totals - 3 out of 3 - the MMnM's went down in what was apparently the closest debate seen at Rathmines. The topic was "That all people under the age of 18 should have to play a team sport at the weekend". Again, the MMnM's were the negative team. This was a very close and interesting debate but Bonnells Bay was the eventual winning team. Both Rathmines teams acquitted themselves very well in these two debates and raised some very interesting points. Next week Rathmines Raiders will travel to Coal Point to conclude their debating season."

# NATIONALLY CONSISTANT COLLECTION OF DATA

Every year, all schools in Australia participate in the Nationally Consistent Collection of Data on School Students with Disability (NCCD). The NCCD process requires schools to identify supports provided to students with disability. This information assists schools to formally recognise the supports and adjustments provided to students with disability and consider how they can strengthen the support of students with disability. The NCCD also provides state and federal governments with the information they need to plan more broadly for the support of students with disability.



### Parliament And Civics Education Rebate – Canberra Excursion

Students from Rathmines Public School will soon be undertaking an education tour of the national capital. Students will be given the opportunity to participate in a variety of educational programs with a focus on Australia's history, culture, heritage and democracy.

The Australian Government recognises the importance of all young Australians being able to visit the national capital as part of their Civics and Citizenship education. To assist families in meeting the cost of the excursion the Australian Government is contributing funding of \$20 per student under the Parliament and Civics Education Rebate program towards those costs. The rebate is paid directly to the school upon completion of the excursion and has already been factored into the cost of the excursion.





