2020: A time to shine!

When speaking to our school community at the start of our **Presentation Day** celebration I mentioned that unfortunately a lot of the commentary that you see in the media or hear in daily conversations is based on a belief that 2020 was shocker of a year and the best thing to do is forget about it, put it behind us, and move onto 2021! I added, that if were to go down that line of writing 2020 off as a bad memory and putting all of our focus on the better days ahead we would be selling ourselves short, not only on a school community level but also on a national level, by focusing on the negative aspects of a tough year rather than the many positives that have come from the way we have approached the challenges associated with COVID 19. It is often the case that when we are placed under pressure, either as individuals or as a community, it can result in something really special and valuable being achieved.

Looking back over this past year there can be no doubt that students, parents, carers and staff members have been placed under a lot of additional pressure but that pressure has resulted in **many shining moments** and as this year concludes I think it is appropriate to highlight just a few:

There have been many shining moments this year and I am pleased to have this opportunity to thank and commend all members of our school community for the very positive and supportive manner in which you responded to the challenges that have come our way during this past year. I extend special thanks to all class teachers, members of the school executive, and the wonderful school administration and support staff for the very professional and committed manner in which they have fulfilled their responsibilities, and for doing all they can to ensure that our students from Kinder through to Year 6 have been provided with a challenging but at the same time nurturing, caring and supportive learning environment during this COVID year.

Affirmation Assemblies

Last Friday, Affirmation Assemblies for our infants classes as well as Stage 2 and Stage 3 were conducted from 9:00am through till 3:00pm. All of the assemblies were livestreamed with a total of 220 parents and carers watching from home or their place of work. I logged in from my office and it was really pleasing to not only see the broad range of achievement areas for children from Kinder through to Year 6 but also to listen to the words of appreciation expressed by the stage supervisors to the teachers and support staff within their teams. I congratulate all students on giving of their best during another busy school year and I add my thanks to the class teachers for organising the stage assemblies, and for the extra effort they have made to affirm the children in their care during such a challenging year.

We have been fortunate to have a number of excellent teachers filling temporary and long term casual positions this year and they have made wonderful contributions to our school. I take this opportunity to express my sincere appreciation to **Rebecca Verschoor** and **James Picot** for the professionalism and sense of commitment they have displayed while fulfilling their class teaching responsibilities this year. Rebecca will be having a break from teaching after the birth of her first child in January and James will be taking

up a permanent teaching appointment at St Phiilips Grammar school in Gosford.

I am very pleased to be able to confirm that Ellouise Wicks, Phoebe Watson, Niesa Case, Joanna Lizdenis, Jason Ruecroft, Lynda Maretich, Clare Cawley, Kim McNulty, Amy Poole and Megan Bowron will continue in their temporary teaching roles at our school next year. I also take this opportunity to welcome Miss Keira Dole, Mrs Leanne Reid and Mr Patrick Wild who will join our fulltime teaching staff next year. Keira will teach Patrick's special education class for three days per fortnight as well as providing additional in class support for our Stage 3 students. Leanne Reid has accepted responsibility for teaching one of the special education classes and Patrick has been appointed to the permanent position of Assistant Principal (Special Education) following Michael Sneesby's decision to take up a position in the Department of Education Well Being unit in Newcastle. As a school we are indebted to Mr Bidstrup for the special contribution he has made to our school while he has been filling the role of Relieving Assistant Principal for Special Education. Tom has led the special education team brilliantly during a challenging period and his leadership has always focused on trying to provide all of the children in the unit with a supportive, caring and engaging learning environment.

We have received a significant number of local enrolment applications during the past two weeks and based on our projected enrolment numbers for 2021 it is highly likely that we will be structuring our teaching responsibilities on having an **additional mainstream class** (15 in total). A final decision in this regard will be made after our enrolments are checked at the start of the term. As a result the full schedule of teaching responsibilities for 2021 will not be published until the commencement of the new school year once the decision between 14 and 15 classes is finalised.

Year 6 of 2020.

Many of the major awards that were presented yesterday related to contributions made by our outgoing Year 6 class and it was fitting that they receive this special acknowledgement as they conclude their primary education at Rathmines. This evening at the Year 6 Farewell Dinner I will be able to join with the Year 6 teachers in thanking and congratulating our Year 6 class of 2020 but I would like to take this chance to commend them for their contributions to Rathmines Public. It has been a particularly challenging year for Year 6 and I know that at times they must have experienced feelings of frustration and disappointment as many of the traditional extra curricula events including their three day excursion to Hill End were cancelled. However, they showed great resilience and hung in there! They remained positive and they continued to be great role models for all of our students through the concern and support they showed for each other, their school and class spirit, their happy and friendly personalities, and their readiness to take on a challenge.

When the Year 6 students were walking along the beaches and over the hills at Pacific Palms early in Term 1, none of us had any idea what was waiting around the corner for us in the form of COVID 19, but during the camp we did talk to the children about the importance of digging deep to face challenges whether it was the steep tracks on their walk, the darkness of the rain forest late at night with our torches turned off, or (for some) the complicated task of putting up a tent! They all handled the Elizabeth Beach challenges really well and most importantly they supported other class members if they

needed help. They have continued to maintain that attitude all year and I thank them sincerely for their contributions to Rathmines Public not just during this tricky year but from when the majority of the class started as little Rascals in 2013 before starting in Kinder in 2014.

Intensive Swimming Scheme

I congratulate all of the students who participated in the annual nine day swimming program which concluded last Thursday. The teachers were very impressed with the manner in which the children conducted themselves during their lessons and while travelling to and from the Toronto Swimming Complex. While all of the students improved their swimming ability and water confidence during the ten days it is important to note that the benefits of the program will be maximized if the children are given the opportunity to further develop their swimming during the holidays. On behalf of all the children in the program I thank **Mr Fisher** for all the time and effort he contributed to organising this extra curricula activity.

2021 to 2024 School improvement Plan

Members of staff are currently working on the development of our next **School Improvement Plan** which will provide our sense of direction for the next four years. I look forward to sharing that plan with all members of our school community early in Term 1 next year. The first step in this planning process was the development of a revised School Vision Statement based on the responses and feedback received from members of the school community. I thank everyone who contributed to this process and, in closing this final newsletter for the year, I would like to share with you once again the Vision, Goals and **Aspirations** have we for Rathmines Public during the next four years: "Rathmines Public School's vision is to pursue and celebrate excellence in all areas and to ensure every student has the opportunity to experience success within a supportive, safe, personalised and engaging learning environment which is free from all forms of discrimination. Our vision is to educate students for life, to enable them to act with moral and ethical integrity, to foster their sense of wellbeing and to develop their personal values of honesty, resilience, empathy, respect and responsibility."

I look forward to working with all members of our school community when we return in 2021 and start on our journey towards achieving our vision for Rathmines Public School. 
