#### **Parent Information Sessions**

I trust that the parent information sessions conducted last week proved to be beneficial for parents and carers. Overviews of the content covered in the meetings are available for anyone who was unable to attend due to other commitments. I take this opportunity to stress that the meetings should be seen as a "first step" in developing a relationship of shared responsibility with class teachers for your child's education. As the school year progresses I encourage you not to hesitate to contact class teachers regarding an appointment if you wish to discuss any matters of concern.

#### **Staffing Update**

I am very pleased to be able to confirm that **Helen Styan** has been appointed to the position of **Teacher Librarian** at Rathmines Public while Rebecca Priest is on maternity leave. **Josie Quinn** and **Joanna Lizdenis** have also commenced temporary teaching contracts at RPS as part of our intervention/support program for students in Stages 2 and 3. Josie will be based in Stage 3 and Joanna will link with Stage 2. Both teachers come with very high recommendations from the Principals of schools in which they have previously been employed and I have no doubt they will make very positive contributions to RPS during the next 20 weeks. In addition, **Dr Andy Mathes** will join our teaching staff every Thursday in order to provide literacy and numeracy extension activities for students in Years 3 and 5. On behalf of everyone in our school community I extend a warm welcome to Helen, Josie, Joanna and Andrew and thank them for accepting these important teaching responsibilities.

#### Year 6 Camp

I have no doubt all of our Year 6 students are looking forward to heading up the coast to Pacific Palms for their outdoor education camp next Monday and Tuesday. During the two days away the children will participate in a range of outdoor education activities designed to firstly challenge them both as individuals and as a group and secondly to build their class identity and sense of cohesion. I thank **Mrs Wicks, Mrs Quinn** and **Mr Elston** for their readiness to take on the extra responsibilities associated with taking a large group of students away on an overnight excursion. I am confident that the children will show their appreciation to the teachers by the exemplary manner in which they conduct themselves during the two days.

#### Spelling Challenge

**Dr Mathes** has provided the following background information about an important curriculum initiative he is coordinating at our school this year.

"At Rathmines Public School we aim to provide the best outcomes for your children in all Key Learning Areas. One of these areas is in the Literacy strand of Spelling. NAPLAN test results provide useful information on individual student levels as well as providing a state-wide performance standard against which we view our overall results. We are encouraging all parents to participate with us on a focus to further strengthen the spelling results of our students. The plan is to have Years 3-6 all participating in a Magical Buzzing Bees Spelling Challenge in a motivating and fun learning environment in Week 10 (Thursday 2nd April). Parents are invited to attend to be part of the audience from 9.00-11.00am for Stage 2 (Years 3-4) and 11.45-1.45pm for Stage 3 (Years 5-6). In the mean-time, be sure to encourage your child to participate to the best of their ability by learning their list words from their weekly Sound Waves Spelling Lists where the words will come from."

I thank Dr Mathes for the time and effort he has contributed to organising this activity and encourage all students to give of their very best when preparing for their participation in the Spelling challenge later in the term.

#### **School Sport Programme**


Students at Rathmines Public are fortunate to be able to participate in a wide variety of sporting opportunities which are provided as part of an overall sports programme for students in primary classes. As we start a new school year I believe there is value in highlighting not only the different aspects of this programme but also the guidelines which the school is required to follow. **Mr McNamara** has the responsibility for overseeing all matters relating to primary sport and has particular responsibility for organising our annual swimming, cross country and athletics carnivals. **Miss Case** provides great support to Troy and is also the school's representative on the Westlakes PSSA Sports Association. As a school we are indebted to Troy and Niesa for all the time and effort they contribute to their roles.


Rathmines Public enters teams in 11 different PSSA competitions and also participates in competitions run by NSW Touch, NSW Rugby, OZtag and the Newcastle Knights. Inclusion in these representative sporting teams is based on the outcome of school based selection trials and guidelines provided by the NSW PSSA. Students who gain selection in a team are required to display a high level of commitment to training sessions before or after school and to also display the highest level of sportsmanship and team spirit when playing for the school. Parents and carers who attend sports events are also expected to act in accordance with the Code of Conduct for parents which has been developed by the Hunter PSSA.

In addition, students with above average ability in a particular sport are eligible to take part in **zone selection trials** conducted by the Westlakes PSSA. Each school is usually restricted to sending a maximum of **four**

**students** to a trial. Selection in a Westlakes squad is the first step on a pathway to possible selection in a NSW PSSA representative team. (eg ex-student **Jake Riley's** inclusion in the NSW PSSA Golf team in 2016). In the same way, students who are selected to represent RPS at the zone swimming, cross country and athletics carnivals, as a result of their performances at a school carnival, have the chance to progress through to Hunter and possibly NSW representation (eg ex student **Cameron Gawn's** selection in the NSW swimming team in 2018). It is important to note that the NSW PSSA is responsible for setting the guidelines for selection procedures.

The Westlakes PSSA also conducts a series of annual **Gala Days** which are **non competitive** and are designed to give **all primary students** the chance to play sport with students from other schools in our zone. These gala days generally run on separate days for junior (Years 3 and 4) and senior (Years 5 and 6) students.

#### **Sports News**

Our school was well represented at the **Zone Swimming Carnival** held at Speers Point Pool Tuesday of last week. **Mrs Bristow**, our school team manager, was very pleased with the manner in which our students conducted themselves throughout the day. I commend all of the children who attended the carnival and offer special congratulations to **Ben M** who came first in the 11yrs Boys backstroke and third in the 5om freestyle, and the boys in our junior relay team which gained a third placing overall. **Ben, Kaizen, Logan F, Tiaki and Thomas R** will represent our school and the Westlakes Zone at the **Hunter Region Swimming Carnival** on the 3rd March.

The boys in our school rugby league team are looking forward to defending the **Paul Harragon Cup** trophy which our school won last year when they take part in the 2020 competition at Keith Barry Oval today. The team has trained really well during the past few weeks and, even though the majority of boys play soccer as their Saturday sport, they seem to have revelled in the contact aspect of rugby league and are keen to test themselves against some of the more traditional rugby league schools in the Newcastle area.





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# **Rathmines Park Draft Concept Master Plans**

Consultation with the community on Rathmines Park during September and October 2019 identified a large number of ideas, features and suggested improvements. Concept Master Plans have been developed to highlight key directions and ideas for the Park.

An *Issues and Opportunities Paper* has also been produced to support the Concept Master Plans and clearly articulate the

potential directions and ideas for the Park. The Paper summarises the key community values of the Park and an initial vision and principles for future use. Potential future opportunities and directions are identified under five key themes which provide overarching direction to the area as a whole.

A series of *Analysis Plans* have also been produced which explore the current conditions and use of the Park and to highlight the potential opportunities.

<u>These Concept Plans are not final</u> and are still to be tested through consultation, design refinement and in response to further site investigations as required.

Whilst a number of proposed projects and opportunities have been identified, Council has many and competing needs for funding allocations. There are existing funding streams available for a small proportion of projects, albeit the full cost of these will only be known once detailed design is undertaken and some projects may need to be staged as a consequence.

As such, part of the road-testing process is to seek feedback on priorities for funding which will then inform the priorities identified in the Plan of Management and Council's subsequent funding commitments.

This survey focusses on those areas where clarification and prioritisation are needed - refer Concept Master Plans for further details.

This survey will take approximately 20 minutes to complete.

# Road rules in school zones

# **Pedestrian crossings**

You cannot stop within 20 metres before a pedestrian crossing or 10 metres after a pedestrian crossing unless there is a control sign permitting parking.

Minimum penalty: \$439 and two demerit points

#### **Double parking**

You may not stop on the road alongside to another vehicle at any time even to drop off or pick up passengers.

Minimum penalty: \$330 and two demerit points

#### Parking on a verge

You cannot stop or park on a verge area (footpath, nature strip, dividing strip or kerb).

Minimum penalty: \$183 and two demerit points

#### Slow down

Stick to the 40km/h speed limit in a school zone and look out for children who may be about.

#### Kiss and ride

Some schools have 'kiss and ride' or 'drop-off and pick-up zones' for children in 'No Parking' zones. If your school has a program in place, remember to always drop off or pick up your child from the designated zone and follow the school's procedures. You can stop in a kiss and ride area for two minutes only to pick up passengers and you must stay within three metres of the vehicle.

If your school does not have a 'kiss and ride' program in place please use the 'No Parking' zone to drop off and pick up passengers.

# PARKING RESTRICTION SIGNS



## You cannot stop here

A driver must not stop in a no stopping zone.

Minimum penalty: \$330 and two demerit points



#### You cannot stop here

You are not allowed to stop your vehicle unless you are driving a bus.

Minimum penalty: \$330 and two demerit points



# You can stop here for two minutes only

You have no more than two minutes to drop off or pick up passengers or goods and the driver must stay within three metres of the vehicle.

Minimum penalty: \$183 and two demerit points



## You cannot stop here

Unless a current Mobility Parking Scheme (MPS) permit is displayed.

Minimum penalty: \$561 and one demerit point

#### About Active OOSH

Active OOSH provide a before school, after school and vacation care program for primary school aged children. We aim to provide a service that is supportive, stimulating, caring and inclusive. We value family partnerships and have an open door policy where families are encouraged to be actively involved in our service. All children are given the opportunity to learn and grow through play and enjoy a large variety of activities and experiences at the service through our child focused programming.

#### K-2 Zone.

The service K - 2 zone is an area that provides children from Kindergarten to Year 2 with a range of age appropriate games and activities. This area is developed to assist younger children with positive transitions to Primary School.

#### Homework.

OOSH homework club operates at the service before and after school care.
Children participate in jolly phonics, home readers, spelling words, mathematics, projects and speeches.
The children are assisted by an educator who will guide them with any questions they may have.

#### Extra curricular.

The service program extra curricular activities everyday based on the children and families interests.

Some of the activities include:

- Dynamic Mosaics art club.
