I encourage parents and carers to take the time to read through the reports with their children and to use the documentation as a guide to setting student learning goals to work towards in the new school year. This will greatly enhance the value of the assessment and reporting process.

School Uniform

Maintaining high standards in regard to the wearing of the correct school uniform has a big impact on our efforts to foster a positive school culture in which all children demonstrate a strong sense of school spirit. I commend all the students who have contributed to this goal during 2019 and I thank parents and carers for your support in this regard. If this situation arises I encourage you to take the lead and purchase shoes that comply with our school uniform requirements. I take this opportunity to remind **all of our senior students** and especially our newly elected school leaders that they have an important role to play in this regard.

The Year 6 Mini Fete which was held last Thursday was an outstanding success as a result of the wonderful financial support received from families within the school. Just over **\$2000** was raised to go towards the purchase of a gift from Year 6 of 2019, during a very busy two hours of children participating in a wide range of fun activities.
