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Dear Parents and Carers,

The following extract from the National NAIDOC committee website provides an insightful and informative background to the theme for this year's NAIDOC Week celebrations.

#### "Always Was, Always Will Be.

Always Was, Always Will Be. recognises that First Nations people have occupied and cared for this continent for over 65,000 years.

We are spiritually and culturally connected to this country. This country was criss-crossed by generations of brilliant Nations. Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people were Australia's first explorers, first navigators, first engineers, first farmers, first botanists, first scientists, first diplomats, first astronomers and first artists. Australia has the world's oldest oral stories. The First Peoples engraved the world's first maps, made the earliest paintings of ceremony and invented unique technologies. We built and engineered structures - structures on Earth - predating well-known sites such as the Egyptian Pyramids and Stonehenge.

#### Vision Statement

Rathmines Public School's vision is to pursue and eglebrate excellence in all areas and to ensure everyone has the opportunity to experience success within a supportive, safe and engaging learning environment which embraces the creative and productive use of technology and is free from all forms of discrimination. Our adaptation and intimate knowledge of Country enabled us to endure climate change, catastrophic droughts and rising sea levels. Always Was, Always Will Be acknowledges that hundreds of Nations and our cultures covered this continent. All were managing the land - the biggest estate on earth - to sustainably provide for their future. Through ingenious land management systems like fire stick farming we transformed the harshest habitable continent into a land of bounty. NAIDOC Week 2020 acknowledges and celebrates that our nation's story didn't begin with documented European contact whether in 1770 or 1606 - with the arrival of the Dutch on the western coast of the Cape York Peninsula. The very first footprints on this continent were those belonging to First Nations peoples. Our coastal Nations watched and interacted with at least 36 contacts made by Europeans prior to 1770. Many of them resulting in the charting of the northern, western and southern coastlines — of our lands and our waters. For us, this nation's story began at the dawn of time. NAIDOC 2020 invites all Australians to embrace the true history of this country — a history which dates back thousands of generations. It's about seeing, hearing and learning the First Nations' 65,000+ year history of this country - which is Australian history. We want all Australians to celebrate that we have the oldest continuing cultures on the planet and to recognise that our sovereignty was never ceded.

#### Always Was, Always Will Be."

Celebrations of **NAIDOC Week** on a national level have been postponed till later in the year due to social distancing guidelines. However our school based celebrations and learning activities will be held as planned during the first week of next term. **Tim Selwyn**, from **Girra Girra Tours** will conduct a professional development session with staff members on Monday during the Staff Development Day and from Tuesday to Thursday will facilitate a range of "hands on" learning activities for students in all grades in an effort to help children develop a deeper understanding, awareness and appreciation of aboriginal history and culture.

**Mrs Megan Bowron** has accepted responsibility for teaching KR while Mrs Roddam is on leave on Tuesdays and Wednesdays each week duringTerms 3 and 4. Megan has worked extensively in the infants classes at RPS in a casual and temporary capacity and is highly regarded for her professionalism and her commitment to providing a supportive and engaging learning environment for the children in her care.

I am very pleased to be able to confirm that **Amanda Greenwood** has been reappointed to the role of **Canteen Supervisor** following a mandatory merit selection process conducted by DEC staffing and recruitment. I congratulate Amanda on her appointment and also take this opportunity to sincerely thank her on behalf of our school community for the wonderful contribution she has made to RPS during her previous four year contract.

#### Rascals Zoom

The social distancing restrictions linked to the management of COVID 19 have necessitated a number of changes to the normal operation of our school procedures during the first half of the year. The three Rascals Zoom sessions which Mrs Ruecroft conducted today with our 55 Kinder 2021 students were another example of the adaptations teachers have made to stay connected and engaged with our current and future students. Members of next year's Kinder classes have also received a commercially produced "RPS Welcoming Video" which is designed to help them become acquainted with the school setting in much the same way as they would have if the regular Rascals playgroup sessions had been able to go ahead. It is our intention to run a couple of Rascals gatherings early next term if restrictions are eased, prior to commencing our Catalina Kids transition program.

#### **Student Late Arrivals**


The DEC closely monitors attendance rates at all primary and secondary schools in order to ensure that appropriate measures are in place to support students whose education is being negatively impacted by interruptions to their schooling. Students arriving at school in time to line up with their class prior commencing lessons at 9:00am is an important element of school attendance and as a result the department requires that all "late arrivals" are recorded in our attendance data. There has been a marked increase in the number of students consistently arriving late for school since we returned to fulltime attendance after the COVID 19 learning from home period. I encourage parents and carers to be really mindful of the importance of avoiding having your children arrive late for school unless there are exceptional circumstances that cannot be avoided. Mrs Ruecroft and I will monitor this pattern during the first two weeks of next term prior to referring individual cases to the department's Home School Liaison Officer for follow up.

#### **Primary Cross Country Carnival**

The children in all classes from Year 2 through to Year 6 are looking forward to the running of our modified cross country carnival within our school grounds tomorrow. The carnival was originally scheduled to be held during the final weeks of first term and was one of the first cancellations arising from the impact of COVID 19. It is the first step in what will hopefully be a gradual resumption of our regular sports program in Term 3. The annual PSSA knockout competitions our school usually participates in have unfortunately been cancelled for this year but we are planning to arrange some "home and away" netball and soccer games against neighbouring schools. # **ROAD RULES AROUND SCHOOLS**

### An Important Message from Lake Macquarie Council

We need your help to keep our kids safe.

Lake Macquarie City Council Rangers have been patrolling schools during term 2.

Due to social distancing restrictions limiting capacity on our public transport system, we have noticed more parents are relying on their vehicles for school drop-off and pick-up.

The safety of all children is our number one priority and we would like your help to communicate to parents the correct parking rules including the following:

No stopping – you cannot stop here unless there is a medical or other emergency

Bus zone – you cannot stop here unless you are driving a bus

**No parking** – you can stop here for two minutes only to drop-off or pick-up and the driver must stay within three metres of your vehicle

**Pedestrian crossings** – you cannot stop within 20 metres before or 10 metres after a pedestrian crossing unless there is a control sign permitting parking

**Double parking** – you cannot stop on the road alongside other vehicles at any time to drop-off or pick-up.

Lake Mac Rangers will be increasing patrols around our local schools during term 3 to monitor illegal parking and safety issues. Rangers will be issuing infringements to drivers not following the rules.

We are asking for your help to communicate this message to all parents to ensure the safety of all your students.
