# From the Principal

During his visit Dave will work with the members of the pilot group, will run a professional development session for the whole staff, and will host a Parent Information session for parents and carers on **Thursday 22<sup>nd</sup> July** at 7pm in the school library. Hopefully this advanced notification will allow as many community members as possible to attend this important presentation. To facilitate maximum attendance Patrick is offering to provide a "child minding" service in the school hall for parents and carers who wish to attend the information session. #### **School Concert**

Students in all classes have been managing to balance their sense of excitement about their participation in the preparation of their concert items with the need to stay focused on giving of their best and cooperating with their class teachers as we approach the end of this busy term. The concert preparation in all classes from kinder through to Year 6 is leading up to the production of our **School Concert Movie** during two days of filming by a production crew on **Tuesday and Wednesday** (3<sup>rd</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup> **August**) in Week 4 of next term. We are very keen to ensure no students miss out on being included in the Concert Movie and with this in mind it will be important to ensure all students attend school on both of those days. The dress/tech rehearsals will take place on Tuesday and Wednesday of Week 3 (27<sup>th</sup>/28<sup>th</sup> July).

#### **Sports News**

The students in our primary classes are looking forward to participating in their **Athletics Carnival** at Wangi Oval on Friday of the first week back next term. This school event serves a dual purpose in that it is used to select the athletes who will represent our school at the **Zone Athletics Carnival on 26<sup>th</sup> July** at Glendale and it also provides a wonderful opportunity for promoting team and school spirit. In this regard I encourage all students to not only give of their very best when representing their sports houses in the various events but also to be enthusiastic when cheering on all of the competitors throughout the day. Trials for the various field events have been conducted at school during the past few weeks. Parents and carers are reminded that due to safety factors and specialist equipment relating to high jump, participation is restricted to children who have provided the school with **written parental permission** confirming that they have received coaching from a qualified athletics coach (e.g. Little Athletics)

#### Winter Holidays

Looking back over Term 2 it is easy to understand while all members in our school community are looking forward to the winter vacation. The ten weeks of this term always incorporate the following range of school and community events over and above the regular teaching and learning programs that are implemented in our classrooms on a daily basis: NAPLAN for Years 3 and 5, Reconciliation Week, ANZAC Day commemorations, the hectic schedule of PSSA sporting carnivals and trials, preparation and participation in Star Struck, and the mid-year assessment and reporting procedures. This year class teachers have had the added challenge of school concert preparation while the members of the executive have been overseeing the implementation of our new Strategic Improvement Plan and have been working through the process of External Validation. I thank all staff members and students for their efforts during this term and offer best wishes to everyone for a relaxing and safe holiday break. The third term will resume for students on Tuesday 13<sup>th</sup> July.
