As part of this restructure in teaching responsibilities Mrs Roddam will teach Mrs Cawley's Year 1/2C on Thursdays and Mrs Russell's 3R class on Fridays. In an additional change for the Year 2R class they will be "relocating" their classroom to the new portable building prior to the end of term. The children have been excited to observe the new smartboard and class furniture being delivered last week and they are no doubt looking forward to taking up residence in their more spacious classroom accommodation.

**Mrs Wicks** has taken maternity leave as she and her husband Rhys look forward to the birth of their first child. I am sure everyone in our school community joins with me in thanking Ellouise for her wonderful contribution to Rathmines Public in her fulltime role as a Year 6 teacher for two years and more recently as one of our part time COVID support teachers. **Brittney Crawford** will join our staff in a part time capacity next term to provide COVID support in stage three as well as providing Beginning Teacher Support (BTS) release time for Miss Dole (Year 6) and Miss Burns (Year 1).

## Parent Reading Sessions

One of the priorities included in the current school plan relates to the strengthening of the partnership between

the school and parents in order to achieve positive outcomes for our students. The two parent information sessions conducted by **Mr Elston** on Monday of this week focusing on the development of Reading skills were designed to enhance parents understanding not only of the strategies employed by class teachers in the teaching of reading but also the steps that parents can take to support their children's reading development at home. I am sure the parents and carers who attended one of the sessions share my sense of appreciation for Mr Elston's readiness to give freely of his time and to share his expertise in this area. ## **New Teaching Resources**

Students in all classes will benefit from the recent purchase of new literacy and numeracy resources with funds donated to the school by the P and C Association. A wide range of practical Maths resources arrived at school this week and have been allocated to all



classes from Kinder to Year 6. In addition, the children in our infants classes (and their parents!) will now have access to additional "home readers" which were purchased in order to cater for our increased number of students from Kinder to Year 2.

## **Visiting Author**

Dr Cameron Stelzer's visit to our school on Monday and Tuesday of this week proved to be an outstanding success with the infants and primary students revelling in their respective interactive workshops which were targeted at "bringing reading and writing to life" and incorporated Dr Cameron's extremely popular and award winning "Pie Rats" and "Scallywags" series. I am conscious of the considerable amount of time and effort in regard to preliminary planning and "on the day' coordination that is needed to ensure that these events run smoothly. Staff and students are indebted to **Mrs Priest** for the role she has played in this regard. I thank Rebecca for providing our students with this great literacy experience and also take this opportunity to thank her for her ongoing commitment to ensuring our school library is a centre of learning and engagement for our students.
